**4. NEW BUSINESS**

**A. PDCA Standards**

- a. Co-Chairman Todd Nugent asked the committee about any direction, if any, the FCA should be taking with the PDCA Industry Standards. Tony Darkangelo informed the committee that FCA CEO Stuart Binstock had conversations with the leadership at PDCA about our future involvement in the standards. Tony expressed to the committee that FCA had no current plans with the PDCA Standards but asked the committee to discuss if FCA should be involved in creating its own standards, look to purchase the standards from PDCA, endorse the current standards or partner with PDCA on the existing and future standards.
- b. Doug Hampton, Ray Fujii and Owen Smith all indicated that these were excellent standards and that the FCA should not look to recreate or take over these documents from PDCA.

- c. Owen Smith and Doug Hampton informed the committee on the history of the PDCA Standards.
- d. Doug Hampton indicated that the cross membership of PDCA, union and non-union, allows for more complete input into the standards.
- e. Doug Hampton is currently involved in the development of the PDCA Standards and reported that PDCA is producing 2 new standards per year. Doug suggested that this committee should get approval from the FCA board to appoint a liaison to the PDCA Standard Committee. Doug indicated that he would like to be that liaison.
- f. Doug Hampton informed the committee that the PDCA is working with AIA to get the PDCA standards into the consensus documents and that CDs with the standards are being passed out at trade shows where architects and designers are in attendance.
- g. Rick Vandegraft – FCAI President, provided information on how his group in Illinois was using the standards, including providing over 400 binders to the local architects which included the standards.
- h. The members of the committee suggested that we do not reinvent the wheel and that we should endorse the current standards.

#### **B. LMCI / FTI Grants**

- a. FCA Vice-President Tony Darkangelo provided information on applying for LMCI and FTI grants.
- b. LMCI Liaison-David Stvartak provided some examples of approved grants and additional details on the application procedures.
- c. Doug Hampton indicated that DC 36 had applied for an LMCI grant but has not received any notification on approval or non-approval of his grant. Dave Stvartak indicated he would look into this and get back to Doug.
- d. The members of the committee were made aware of the requirement to have the local JATC fund merged with the national fund to qualify for a FTI grant.

#### **C. LEED**

- a. Co-Chairman Paul Buzzin asked about the committees experience with LEED and how it was being used in their businesses.
- b. Doug Hampton expressed the need for LEED AP in his company. Discussion followed.
- c. Co-Chairman Paul Buzzing asked FCA's Kristin Bromberg to provide an overview on requirements and update on LEED education. Kristin provided information on the following:
  - i. New requirements starting July 1
  - ii. Awareness classes FCA provides
  - iii. LEED V3
  - iv. LEED credentials – Associate and Specialty

- b. Mike LeGood provided information on “No Burn” that was manufactured to be fire and mold resistant. Mike provided detailed information about the product including the website and manufacturing location.
